

The Heart of Christ

I will take you from the nations and gather you from all the countries and bring you into your own land. I will sprinkle clean water upon you, and you shall be clean from all your uncleannesses, and from all your idols I will cleanse you. A new heart I will give you, and a new spirit I will put within you. Ezekiel 36:24-26a

We are now in the season of Lent. Lent is a penitential season of the church. This means it is time for inward reflection and recognition of our sin not so that we are miserable, but so that we might look toward Christ as our true and only hope even more than we already do. As we enter the season of Lent, you will notice a common theme that keeps coming up – the human heart. Our heart is an interesting thing. I am not talking about the physical organ which pumps blood throughout the body, but the spiritual organ that pumps our desires and longings throughout our soul. The spiritual heart is fascinating; it has the capacity to be rock hard or it can be compassionate. Our spiritual heart can be unmoving or it can be gracious. Our spiritual heart can be unforgiving or it can be merciful.

By ourselves, by our own powers, our hearts would never change. They would remain hard, unmoving, and unforgiving our whole lives. But this is NOT your heart. The scripture passage above says that God will "give you a new heart, and a new spirit I will put within you." This is a divine prophecy fulfilled when God switched out your hard heart and has given you Christ's compassionate heart. God has switched out your unmoving heart and has given you Christ's gracious heart. God has switched out your unforgiving heart and has given you Christ's merciful heart.

God has truly made you a new person. God is not talking metaphorically above, or symbolically above or using some flowery language from a poem. In Christ, you really ARE a new people with new hearts – Christ's heart.

As we travel through this season of Lent, I pray that it will be a time for our congregation to look honestly into the depths of our hearts and yearn more and more, every day, to be transformed by Christ's compassion, graciousness and mercy toward ourselves and others. Amen.



"You've never been in a Bible study. You've never been baptized. You didn't know a thing about church membership, and yet you made it!"

In a sermon, Begg pictures an imaginary angel at the pearly gates, growing frustrated during the sinful thief's entrance interview. After

receiving no clear answers from the thief about doctrines such as justification, the angel finally asks, "On what basis are you here?" The thief simply replies, "The man on the middle cross said I can come."




















BUTTERFLY — The butterfly symbolizes resurrection, Easter and the new life we have in Christ Jesus. As a caterpillar disappears into a chrysalis, so Jesus' lifeless body was hidden in a tomb. The emergence of the butterfly, rising into the sky in its beautiful new body, reminds us of Christ's resurrection — and ours.



Try this chilly new take on a healthy snack.

What you need:

- 30 grapes, washed and dried
- ½ cup vanilla yogurt
- 4 graham crackers, crushed
- Toothpicks
- Parchment paper

What you do:

- On a baking sheet lined with parchment paper, arrange grapes in a single layer. Freeze for two hours.
- 2. Insert a toothpick into each grape.
- Dip each grape into the yogurt, coating half of it.
- 4. Roll each dipped grape in the crushed crackers. Place back on the parchment.
- 5. Freeze for two more hours. Enjoy!
