STEWARDSHIP . . . What a Relief!

So often when we discuss stewardship, we speak in terms of obligation and responsibility. We think of what we *owe* God, in response to what God has given to us. While these are legitimate pieces of stewardship, what about the other side of the coin? When is the last time you thought about your responsibilities as a steward and felt an overwhelming sense of *relief??* Never? Well, maybe you should.

We know that everything we have belongs to God. Put another way – none of us really owns *anything*! Everything we ever had, have now, or will ever have in the future is God's. We are all temporary managers of God's belongings. When we forget this, we run into problems.

When we think of ourselves as *owners* of our money and possessions . . . one period of economic hardship can lead to more than a financial crisis – it can be a spiritual one as well. We might begin asking how God could let this happen to us. In fact, we are simply managers of these resources, acting as generously and faithfully as possible, making wise decisions and investments. Some things are simply out of our control.

When we think of ourselves as *owners* of the earth . . . it is easier to misuse environmental resources when you view them as *yours*. We develop a sense of entitlement. This land is *mine*, so I should be able to do whatever I want with it. But if the land is *God's*, and you have been entrusted with its care, it feels a bit different. Whenever we witness a hurricane or an earthquake, we are reminded that we are not in control of the earth. It is interesting that we refer to these things as "acts of God." What if we thought of everything we do regarding our environment as an "act on God's behalf?"

When we think of ourselves as *owners* of our families . . . recognizing that our loved ones actually belong to God involves a lot of trust. A friend once reminded me that my kids are really on loan to me (even though I can't return them like my library books!) I have an amazing opportunity to journey with them, care for them, and influence them, knowing that their lives truly belong to God. This changes how we experience times of transition and loss. After eighteen years or so, it will be time to let go and put even more trust in God. When someone we love dies, we recognize that while we had the privilege of loving them, they belong to God. And God loves them even more than we ever could.

We are merely managers of the multitude of blessings God has given to us. Our responsibility is to act as faithfully and responsibly as possible when it comes to stewardship – in many ways, the results are in God's hands . . . what a relief!
